- April 1st Free Tree Event Long-term Recovery, Marion County partnership with Doug Fir Giveaway. What started as 18k DF donation from Marion County, jump to additional 55,600 trees from ODF, and 52,000 native plants donated from BEF. All natives found homes, 37,965 DF, 7,000 WRC, 3,040 GF and 200 PP were claimed by the end of the event. Minimum of 177 individuals pre-registered for just trees; majority in the wildfire perimeter. RFranco helped store the natives until the event; 2 yards of sawdust was donated from Highway Fuels; over 10 volunteers and staff from Marion County and LTRG helped.
