

Purpose

Mongold IRTC is a stewardship sale or integrated resource timber contract (IRTC) that sold in 2014. The IRTC contract was chosen for the following reasons:

 To retain receipts on the district to fund restoration projects around Detroit Lake.

 To allow the purchaser to tell us how to remove timber in a complicated setting.

 To improve stand health in a high use recreation area and along the Hwy 22 corridor.

Mongold IRTC was sold with an estimated 5650 tons of merchanta sawtimber.

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Receipts processed as of March 30th 2015 show that 5,277 tons have been removed. This is 93.4% of the total estimated tons. The receipts for the 5,277 tons translates to \$86,746.53 The remaining receipts might increase this number to around \$90,000. Keep in mind that there are variables such as overrun, underrun and the quality of timber yet to be processed that could influence the overall total.
